## 1950's

1952 found the monks living in a bungalow on the edge of the site, and the sisters and oblates living about a mile away in two ordinary houses which had to be changed from monastery to school and back in the course of the day. Sheep grazed on the fields.

In 1954 Dom Edmund Jones became parish priest. By then part of the new parish complex was built and the sisters and the school moved into temporary accommodation upstairs in the new building—living literally on top of a very lively parish caused problems with monastic silence. The school wasn't the only source of income, soon orders were being taken for vestments.
