

Th' apos - tles saw the ris - en Lord.


His risen flesh with radiance glowed,



on Zion, my holy mountain.'

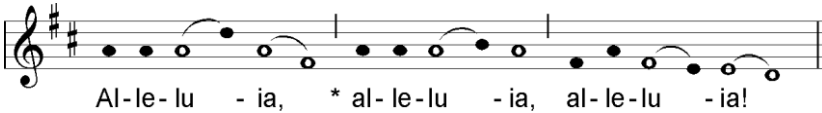
( I will announce the decree of the Lord:

and his name will be written on their foreheads.


It will never be night again,
