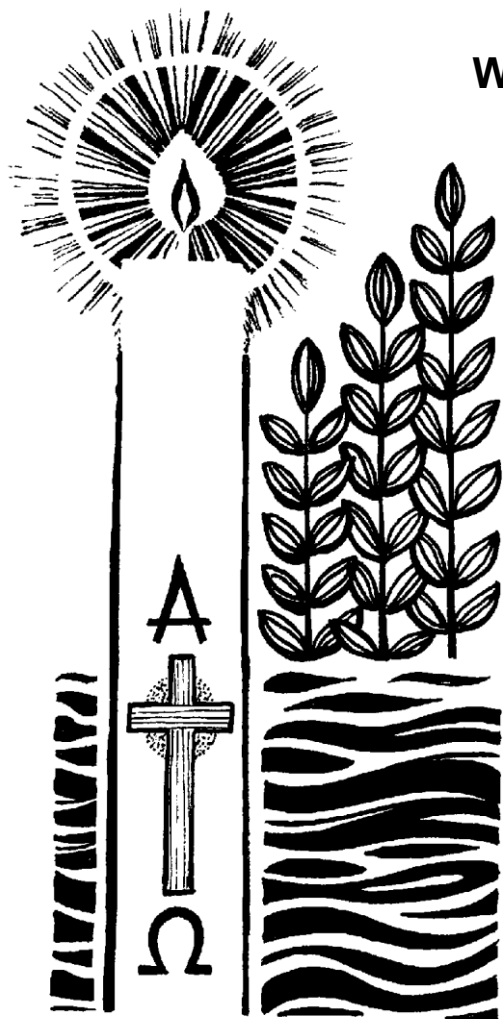

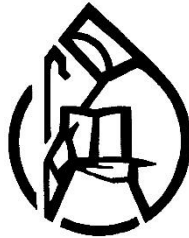



for his love endures for ever.


He let Israel inherit their land,
