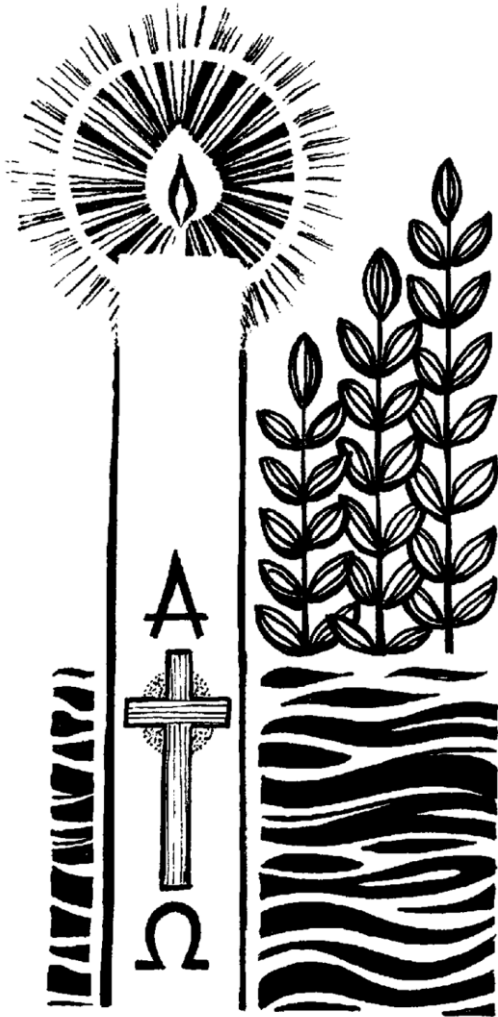

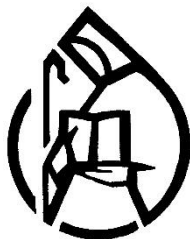



at the sight of your judgements.


Walk through Zion, walk all round it;
